

What is Social Bookmarking

Social bookmarking services, like Delicious.com, allow users to save links to Web sites, organize them with unique tags and descriptions, and then share them with the world.

Unlike Web browser bookmarks and favorites, which are restricted to a specific computer, [Delicious](http://Delicious.com) allows users to view and add to their bookmarks from any computer with access to the Web.

Using Delicious with students

Using [Delicious](http://Delicious.com) as a browser homepage or desktop shortcut can help you direct students to Web sites and resources.

Creating an account with a class will allow students to contribute to a list of resources and lead to discussions on how to select appropriate tags and write user friendly descriptions.

Next Steps

[Delicious](http://Delicious.com) has added the ability to Send new bookmarks to e-mail accounts, Twitter accounts, and other [Delicious](http://Delicious.com) users as you create them.

[Delicious](http://Delicious.com) also provides RSS feeds for all of an account's bookmarks or just the bookmarks with a specific tag. These feeds can be monitored using an Aggregator like [GoogleReader](http://GoogleReader.com), or they can be incorporated in to a Web site or Blog so new bookmarks are automatically displayed.

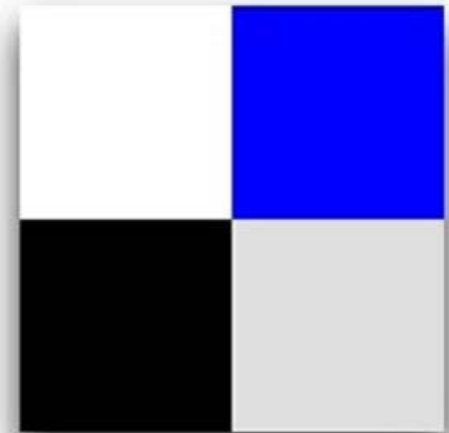

- click on the Join Now link

- enter your account details
- the User Name you select will be part of your unique URL
- click the Register button

Register

- the next page will ask you to Add bookmarking buttons these are specific to your browser and will allow you to add bookmarks and quickly access your account

- the next page will allow you to import any bookmarks previously saved in your browser or from another bookmarking service

- if you do not wish to import old bookmarks you can Skip this step

- after the above steps your registration will be complete and Delicious will help you add your first bookmark
